Lambert reflects on terrific career at SHS

For nine years, Suzette Lambert and Signal Hill School have fit together hand in glove. That time, however, is coming to a conclusion, as Lambert will retire as the Superintendent of Signal Hill School District 181 at the close of the school year.

"There are so many things I have enjoyed at Signal Hill," said Lambert, who took over as SHS superintendent in July 2007. "First, I believe my entire career has been the enjoyment of the students we have been able to reach and teach. The pride you feel as a superintendent is no different from a classroom teacher, just a little further removed. Also, the excellent educators I have had the pleasure to be associated with. The staff at SHS is second to none. The accomplishments they make in education are outstanding. Finally, the wonderful people I have met while being a part of this great Signal Hill family."

All in all, Signal Hill has flourished during Lambert's tenure. With financial support from the Signal Hill Education Foundation (SHEF), the school has implemented a Spanish program and significantly improved its technological capabilities by adding Promethean Boards in every classroom, Chromebooks and charging carts to various classrooms, and upgrading teachers' computers, among other notable accomplishments.

"During very difficult financial times for the State, we have remained financially stable," Lambert said. "SHS has been awarded over \$1 million in competitive grants. This helped us to maintain all of our long-standing extra-curricular offerings—fine arts, band and choir and a talented and gifted program. We have been able to employ a full-time social worker who also teaches a leadership class.

The school building itself has seen many upgrades and improvements, and two Safe Routes to School grant awards of \$400,000 provided for our new walking trail and connecting sidewalks."

Lambert is quick to praise others for the school's successes.

"Over my nine years with Signal Hill School we have accomplished so much and I say 'we' because it truly is a combined effort of many," she said. "Our principal, Mrs. (Kelly) West, for her leadership skills; the teachers for their never-ending desire to be the best teachers they can be; the parents for supporting this wonderful school; the Board of Education for all their support and foresight into making it all come together; our PTO for finding ways to be a part of the educational system; and, of course, SHEF for being a long-term support system for Signal Hill School and allowing the visions of the school to happen."

Undoubtedly, Lambert will miss Signal Hill.

"Mostly, I will miss all the good times and good memories," she said. "If I could just fold them up and put them in a book to pull out every once in a while, that would be great."
